Report from Principal:

SEP conferences will be Wednesday, Thursday with Thursday being a half-day along with Friday. Melissa Jansen asked for drop-off protocol if you have students at Clayton. Supervision will be at both schools to allow drop-off 10 minutes before. Having drop-off at same time will allow for parents to drop off in one swoop.

 - 6th grade Graduation & Celebration: June 1st (will be streamed on zoom & recorded) and Wednesday the 2nd will have a celebration in gym for graduates.

- Governers press conference regarding mask mandate: Melissa Ford spoke about board meeting on Tuesday, which is when it will be decided, but guess is that mandate would be kept until the end of school. Bruce asked if that means it will be kept through summer school. Probably will

not be mandated but highly recommend. There will never be a point where masks are not welcome in the schools.

From the Board

- Looking for feedback on next year's budget. School district budget is around \$320 Million dollars. Board Meeting on June 4th will be about budget so suitable time for public to weigh in. One of the pieces of the budget that Melissa is looking for feedback on is our business administrator is recommending changing tax rate to pay off bond that was taken to rebuild schools. Asking for property tax increase but will keep what you are paying the same instead of dropping as currently planned. This would put money into capital fund to support sustainability resolution (carbon neutral by 2025), and vestibules for protected entry (\$100,000 a school). It is a hard ask to increase property taxes but should not cost more out of taxpayers' pockets. This would be an on-going rate increase. Direct taxpayers with questions to Melissa Ford. Budget is all online under board tab.
- Board is considering adjusting Board Members compensation. Would like feedback. Currently they get paid \$3,000 a year plus a computer. Most school board members get paid \$12,000 a year. Would be funded out of general funds. Would increase about \$60,000 a year.
- Mask mandate will be discussed on Tuesday.
